ENTRENUITY ACCELERATOR COHORT

COACHING ENTREPRENEURS. CULTIVATING LEADERS. CREATING CHANGE.

The <u>Entrenuity Accelerator Cohort (EAC)</u> is more than a business program—it's a launchpad for impact-focused entrepreneurs. Blending culturally relevant coaching, contextual insight, and a faith-informed commitment to equity, the EAC equips Black, Brown, and women entrepreneurs to overcome barriers and thrive within a supportive community.

In 2024, two cohorts were actively engaged in the program, participating in intensive coaching, peer collaboration, and strategic planning powered by the SUN Suite tool from StartingUp Now. Together, they addressed the core challenges of early-stage ventures—building financial sustainability, refining business models, and expanding their networks.

Cohort 1 (Oct 2023–June 2024) achieved remarkable outcomes, including significant revenue growth, program expansion, and strengthened leadership capacity—positioning participants to scale their visions and better serve their communities. **Their combined total net revenue generation was \$1.1 million!**

Cohort 2 (Oct 2024-present) has already begun building on this momentum and is well on its way to achieving similar success.

EAC SPOTLIGHT:

WALTER MENDENHALL & THE MALE MOGUL INITIATIVE

Walter Mendenhall, a former NFL running back and proud Chicago native, took his first entrepreneurship class with L. Brian Jenkins in 2016, using the StartingUp Now curriculum. That experience sparked the vision for the Male Mogul Initiative, a nonprofit focused on equipping young men of color with the tools, training, and confidence to lead and succeed.

In 2023, Walter returned to Entrenuity—this time as a Founder and CEO—to join the inaugural Entrenuity Accelerator Cohort (Oct 2023 to June 2024). The EAC helps early-stage entrepreneurs and nonprofit leaders build sustainable, scalable organizations through intensive coaching, strategic planning, and tools like the SUN Suite.

Through the EAC, Walter deepened his understanding of organizational finance, strengthened his leadership, and secured the largest grant in Male Mogul's history, allowing for the purchase of a building and the launch of CoLab, Chicago's first youth-focused small business incubator.



Today, Male Mogul serves 3,000+ youth and has created more than 200 jobs, a testament to Walter's leadership and Entrenuity's enduring impact. Walter's journey reflects the full arc of Entrenuity's mission—from inspiration to transformation—and the power of entrepreneurship to shape communities for generations.

EAC SPOTLIGHT:

TEIRRA SCOTT & GODDESS MENTORING

Teirra Scott first encountered Entrenuity as a youth in one of Brian Jenkins' early financial literacy classes. Over two decades later, she returned—not as a student, but as the founder of GODDESS Mentoring, an organization dedicated to equipping young girls with confidence, purpose, financial literacy, and wellness.

In 2023, Teirra reconnected with Entrenuity as a participant in the Know More Nonprofits Innovation Challenge, where she was named the \$25,000 grand prize winner. The Challenge marked a turning point in her leadership journey.

Following the Challenge, Teirra joined Entrenuity's inaugural Accelerator Cohort, deepening her strategic leadership and scaling her impact. Since founding GODDESS Mentoring, she has mobilized over 50 volunteers, led youth conferences impacting 300+ girls, and developed SEL-aligned curriculum that helped reduce suspension rates for Black girls by 37% in participating schools.

Teirra was also selected as an Obama Foundation
USA Leader for 2024–2025. Teirra's journey reflects
Entrenuity's full-circle impact: inspiring youth,
equipping leaders, and fueling sustainable change—
one entrepreneur at a time.

FACILITATOR TRAINING: EQUIPPING LEADERS

TO MULTIPLY IMPACT

A TRAIN THE TRAINER

Entrenuity's Facilitator Trainings empower aspiring entrepreneurs—and the educators, mentors, and community leaders who support them—with the tools to launch sustainable businesses and guide others on their path to ownership. Through our partnership with StartingUp Now, participants receive hands-on training in a proven entrepreneurship model that has helped thousands turn ideas into real ventures.

In 2024, StartingUp Now (SUN) expanded its impact with the launch of two powerful new tools: **SUN for Educators (SUN EDU)** and **SUN Behind the Walls (SUN BTW)**.

Entrenuity trained 20 new Facilitators last year, who in turn trained over 150 entrepreneurs across schools, prisons, ministries, and nonprofit organizations. Together, they are multiplying the reach of entrepreneurship—community by community, one leader at a time.






SUN FOR EDUCATORS (SUN EDU)

A streamlined, turnkey entrepreneurship curriculum built specifically for high school classrooms. Featuring ready-to-teach lesson plans, rubrics, and interactive tools, SUN EDU integrates seamlessly with Google Classroom and Canvas, making it easier than ever for educators to bring real-world business learning into their schools.





SUN BEHIND THE WALLS (SUN BTW)

A native application designed to equip incarcerated individuals with the knowledge and structure to plan, launch, and sustain a business—both during incarceration and after release. Built for use without internet access, SUN BTW offers a transformative path to self-sufficiency through entrepreneurship.



FACILITATOR SPOTLIGHT:

Charles Anderson

Charles Anderson, Founder and CEO of Epiphany
Life Change, was one of the first instructors to
implement SUN Behind The Walls (SUN BTW) inside a
correctional facility. Anderson describes SUN BTW as a
powerful tool for helping incarcerated men reclaim their
sense of purpose, agency, and possibility.

For many participants, reentry brings uncertainty—years out of the workforce, limited options, and atrophied decision-making skills. **SUN BTW** addresses this by offering a hands-on tool to develop a business plan, explore market strategies, and make real choices that mirror life outside. "Incarceration weakens the decision-making muscle," Anderson says. "SUN BTW helps them work that muscle again."

Unlike traditional book-based teaching, **SUN BTW** allows participants to engage with the comprehensive technology of the **SUN Suite**, providing full access entirely offline. Anderson structured the use of **SUN BTW** around group collaboration, fostering teamwork and restoring social skills essential for reentry.

With no internet access, participants also reached out to family members for research

support—reigniting relationships and creating a shared sense of investment in their futures.

Anderson's takeaway regarding SUN BTW: "It worked wonders for my class! SUN BTW isn't just business education—it's restoration in motion."





SUN SUITE SPOTLIGHT:

University of Iowa Collaboration

In 2024, Entrenuity expanded its collaboration with the University of lowa's Jacobson Center (part of the John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center (JPEC), providing Iowa educators free access to both the University's BizInnovator curriculum and the SUN Suite from Entrenuity and StartingUp Now. This pilot allowed teachers to explore two complementary entrepreneurship programs at no cost–bringing innovative tools directly to their classrooms.

Dawn Bowlus, Director of the Jacobson Institute, joined Entrenuity for a three-day Facilitator Training, which provided her with a deeper understanding of the curriculum and insight into how these resources can collectively support aspiring young entrepreneurs in lowa classrooms.

The partnership continues to empower lowa educators with innovative, complementary entrepreneurship resources while honoring Entrenuity founder L. Brian Jenkins' deep connection to his alma mater. **Go Hawks!**

OAD PRODUCTIONS

CELEBRATING CULTURE, CREATIVITY & COMMUNITY

In 2024, OAD Productions continued to thrive as Entrenuity's creative production arm, bringing people together through live music, storytelling, and intentional curation. From civic engagement to cultural celebration, OADP transformed Overflow Coffee into a vibrant venue for both local talent and national conversations, hosting 16 public events, supporting over 160 artists, and facilitating 24 private rentals. Local artists praised OADP for creating a sacred, transformative space for diverse expression, calling OADP a launchpad for growth, healing, and connection. For many artists, OADP became both a platform and a family.





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MOX.E COWORKING



ADVANCING BUSINESS & BUILDING COMMUNITY

In 2024, Mox.E Coworking thrived as a dynamic hub for entrepreneurs, professionals, and event hosts—highlighted by a multi-day, full-floor booking from an international production company that showcased the space's versatility. Steady growth in memberships, virtual mail clients, and rentals reinforced Mox.E's essential role in supporting small business operations in the South Loop.

Mox.E deepened its role as a community hub in 2024, offering workshops, networking events, and curated experiences designed to equip and inspire. From branding and customer discovery to newsletter launches, vendor markets, and seasonal socials, Mox.E created spaces where entrepreneurs—especially women and men of color—could sharpen their skills, grow their networks, and build with purpose.

Each gathering fueled growth, connection, and momentum—making Mox.E more than a place to work, but a place to grow.

FROM SIDE HUSTLE TO SUCCESS: FINDING BELONGING AT MOX.E

In 2021, while working remotely and caring for her grandmother during the pandemic, Jessica found Mox.E Coworking. What began as a weekly retreat to focus on her side hustle soon became a transformative chapter in her life. Filled with light and warmth, the space nurtured her creativity, confidence, and purpose.

Over the next three years, she grew her business, scaled back her day job, built lasting friendships, gained new clients, and stepped into leadership—hosting workshops and launching newsletters to help others grow, too.

"Mox.E is more than a coworking space," she shared. "It's a place that supports every part of who I am—entrepreneur, employee, caregiver, creative."










OVERFLOW COFFEE

After a brief fall closure, we reopened Overflow in late October with Jason Poleon, the general manager of Common Cup, assuming leadership of Overflow as well. Jason moved quickly to stabilize operations and reconnect with the community. Despite the restart, Overflow served over 16,000 customers—a testament to strong demand and loyal support. A full calendar of events and private rentals brought new energy and expanded brand awareness.

WHAT IS EOS?



- To strengthen leadership at every level of the organization




2024 Income
